## Police

Eight forces provide police services in Scotland. Two of these, Dumfries & Galloway and Fife, cover the same areas as the councils of the same name. The remaining six cover more than one council area - Central Scotland, Grampian, Lothian & Borders, Northern, Strathclyde and Tayside - and are administered by joint boards of councillors.

### Crimes: clear up rates

#### 1: The percentage of crimes cleared up.

##### *What the indicator reports*

The effectiveness of police crime detection can be measured by the proportion of crimes which are cleared up. A crime is regarded as 'cleared up' if there is sufficient evidence to justify a report being submitted to the procurator fiscal. 'Cleared up' does not, however, necessarily mean that in every case someone was arrested and charged.

##### *Points to bear in mind*

Clear-ups may be affected by the types of crimes recorded. Some crimes are more likely than others to be cleared up - for example, when someone is attacked and is able to identify the person who was responsible.

The indicator expresses the number of crimes cleared up in the reporting year as a percentage of the number of crimes recorded in the same period. However, some of the crimes reported as cleared up may, in fact, have been recorded in previous years.

#### 2: The number and percentage of selected crimes cleared up:

- a) serious violent crime
- b) housebreaking
- c) car crime

##### *What the indicator reports*

While indicator 1 above provides a general measure of effectiveness of clearing up recorded crime, this indicator provides information on three crimes (or groups of crimes) selected for their interest to the general public.

##### *Points to bear in mind*

Clear-up rates for the different categories will vary. The victim may be able to describe the offender in cases of crimes against persons, while there may be no witness to property crimes. Similarly, clear ups may vary from one locality to another. In rural areas, where the population is more static and local people are more likely to know each other, they may notice offenders more easily and be able to give descriptions of them to the police.

The indicator expresses the number of crimes cleared up in the reporting year as a percentage of the number of crimes recorded in the same period. However, some of the crimes reported as cleared up may, in fact, have been recorded in previous years.

## Telephone Answering Times

### **3: The proportion of 999 calls answered within 10 seconds.**

#### ***What the indicator reports***

This indicator shows the proportion of 999 calls that are answered within the national target time of 10 seconds.

#### ***Points to bear in mind***

All police forces have electronic recording equipment which records 999 calls.

The time for each call is the period from the call being received at the control room until it is answered.

The number of staff assigned to answering 999 calls within a control room will affect this indicator.

The indicator does not measure the time to deploy police officers. There is no automatic immediate attendance by police officers to an incident following a 999 call. The speed and level of response is dependent on a wide range of factors including the nature of the incident, the availability of officers and the relative priority of the incident within the context of other matters being dealt with at the time.

## Sickness Absence

### **4: The proportion of working time lost to sickness absence for police officers and civilian staff.**

#### ***What the indicator reports***

The indicator measures the percentage of police officer and civilian employee time lost due to sickness absence.

#### ***Points to bear in mind***

Sickness absence is any absence from the place of employment because of the employee's illness or injury for which sick leave entitlement is used. This could be as a result of self-certification, absence supported by a doctor's certificate, long-term sickness absence, or industrial injury. Absence that is not sickness absence, for example compassionate leave, career leave and special leave/unpaid leave, maternity and paternity leave and maternity support, is not included.

There are different patterns of work both between and within forces - some work 4 day 40 hour shifts while others work 5 day 40 hour shifts. Working patterns should not influence the overall percentage of lost time due to sickness because the numerator (sick days) and the denominator (days available to work) will alter correspondingly. Similarly, variation between forces in the number of public or local holidays will only have a minimal effect on the percentage sickness levels.

Some variation in sickness absence rates between forces for civilian staff may be explained by the variation in the extent to which forces use traffic wardens, who generally have higher levels of sickness absence than other civilian staff.

## Complaints

**5: The number of complaints per 100 members of the police force.**

### *What the indicator reports*

This indicator shows the number of complaints that are made against members of the police force including police officers, support staff and special constables

### *Points to bear in mind*

The level of complaints will provide an indication of the quality of service that is being provided by the force.

For the purposes of this indicator a complaint is defined as any complaint made by or on behalf of any person against one or more on duty members of a police force and from which it may be reasonably inferred that any act or omission which was committed or made by any of the individuals concerned amounts to professional or criminal misconduct.

## Racially motivated incidents

**6: The number of racist incidents per 1,000 population and the proportion of racially aggravated crimes cleared up.**

### *What the indicator reports*

This indicator shows the number of racist incidents and racially aggravated crimes that are reported to the police and the percentage of those crimes that are cleared up. A racist incident is any incident that is perceived to be racist by a victim or any other person.

Racially aggravated crimes include those of racially aggravated harassment and racially aggravated conduct.

### *Points to bear in mind*

The indicator stems from the findings of the Macpherson Report into the Stephen Lawrence enquiry. There is likely to be a significant increase in the number of racist incidents recorded by all forces over the coming years. Recommendations within the Macpherson are aimed at increasing reporting levels of racist incidents in order that the full scale of racist activity can be reliably assessed.

## Drug offences

- 7:     **a) The weight of class A drug seizures and the percentage change compared with previous years**
- b) The number of recorded offences for supply and possession with intent to supply class A drugs and the percentage change compared with previous years.**

### *What the indicator reports*

The indicator reports both the weight and percentage change in police drug seizures and in recorded offences for supply or possession with intent to supply drugs.

### *Points to bear in mind*

The current national strategy is for intelligence led operations against main dealers. This may result in a lower number of seizures, but conversely the quantity of drugs seized and their value will be high. These high profile operations may result in greater disruption to the drugs trade, which, whilst having a positive effect, will also reduce the number of seizures.

## Road policing/safety

- 8:     **The number of persons killed or injured as a result of road accidents and the percentage change compared with previous years.**

### *What the indicator reports*

This indicator reports the number of persons killed or injured as a result of road accidents. It reports the number of fatal and serious casualties and slight road accident casualties.

## Police Reports

- 9:     **The number and percentage of police reports sent to the Children's Reporter within 14 calendar days.**

### *What the indicator reports*

The indicator reports the speed with which the police process reports and send them to the Children's Reporter.

### *Points to bear in mind*

The national Standards for Scotland's Youth Justice Service set a target for police forces to deal with reports within 10 working days. The standard is not intended to reduce the existing police target of 14 calendar days.

## Police

### Road policing/safety

**10: The number and percentage of police reports sent to the Procurator Fiscal within 28 working days.**

#### ***What the indicator reports***

The indicator reports the speed with which the police process reports and send them to the Procurator Fiscal.

#### ***Points to bear in mind***

The Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal service and ACPOS has set a target for police forces to deal with 80% of reports within 28 days.

### Police
